It's been nearly ten months since the residents of Lavallette and surrounding communities have had access to library service, a result of the Ocean County Library's Upper Shores Branch being damaged by Superstorm Sandy. Ocean County Library staff in branches closest to Lavallette have enjoyed serving our northern barrier island customers during this time.

The branch will open on Saturday, Aug. 24 at 10 a.m. "We are working diligently to restore the Upper Shores Branch to the way it was before the storm," said Library Director Susan Quinn. "We appreciate the patience of the community, the Friends of the Library, and our local officials in Lavallette as we work to restore the branch." "A grand reopening event is being planned for the fall.

Following the storm, there was also extensive damage to the Bay Head Reading Center's interior. Students from the Ocean County Vocational Technical School's Brick Center, under the supervision of the Library's Facilities Supervisor Joseph Cahill, assisted with

surfers ride the wave of recovery

PANEL DISCUSSION & FILM SERIES

The Ocean County Library will present "Ride the Wave of Recovery," a panel and film series with local surfers that will explore how Superstorm Sandy affected the surfing community.

These discussions will be moderated by Paul Hart, a curator from Tuckerton Seaport, which also houses the New Jersey Surf Museum. Topics discussed will include the evolution of surfing over the past 50 years, as well as how surfers helped with recovery efforts after Superstorm Sandy.

"Landfall: The Eyes of Sandy," a film produced by A.D. Pictures, will also be shown as part of the program. The film documents the approach and aftermath of Superstorm Sandy in Stafford and Long Beach Island.

The work of photographer Lisa Coen will also be displayed at the Long Beach Island Branch during the month of October. The exhibit will consist of surf and recovery photos. Her journalist husband, John, will take part in the panel discussions and is a part of the "Landfall" film.
